Our capital campaign is a "spring sprint" with a June 9 finish line. How will we measure success?

June 9th is only a few weeks away which is the reason we are calling this campaign a *sprint*.

Very soon, we will be run through



the finish line and consider how fast we "ran" in this spring. "How did it go?" "Was it a successful campaign?" Here are some questions we will ask in order to evaluate our spring sprint campaign?

- Have we prayed like this is a once in a 100 years event? Individually, in small group settings, and as a congregation, did we ask God for a new era at our church when we are engaging our community for the glory of Christ and our joy on a new level? Did our children and grandchildren hear many voices pray in many different contexts? (Remember, the last time our church built a completely new structure was in 1892!)
- Did we have broad participation: not equal gifts but equal sacrifice? We have an overall goal financial for the goal of our campaign I'll get to that in a few questions but just as important as the overall amount we achieve is a broad-based participation by our whole church family. I am praying we have a very high percentage of our people who make commitments.
- Did we put the gift of our time into this campaign? Have we made it a priority to attend meetings and to sprint right through April and May?
- Have we kept in mind the ministry reasons we are committed to this campaign? Accessibility to a "brickcenter" where we can have all church activities, a kitchen!, classrooms, and a corner that will catch the attention of people and invite our community to be part of our church family.
- Are we picturing how God will use this program to reach people with the good news of Jesus? How will it make a difference to have a new AWANA circle? How will our seniors use a new fellowship space to have meetings to go to when they don't need to deal with steps and ramps? What will it mean to families at funeral luncheons to have a larger, more open area?
- Have we meditated on 1 Peter 2:5? First Peter 2:5 reads, "You yourselves like living stones are being built up as a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." These verses form the theme of what our campaign is all about. We must think biblically. We are adding literal bricks so we can add the figurative bricks of people and be mortared into one another's lives.
- Have we been disciplined, follow-through people who keep commitments we make to different roles in the campaign?
- Have we had fun? One of the critical ways we teach one another and enjoy life is to have fun together. This
 campaign should be filled with laughter it's a kind of excitement we only have in our church every one hundred
 years.
- Have we maintained a global mindset? As a part of our campaign, we are sending the Michalek family to Thailand. Our commitment to missions is not something we are haphazardly adding to this campaign. It's a way to remind our church we are all about the Great Commission?
- Have we invited new people to visit our church? Could there be a more exciting time to invite one of your neighbors to visit?
- Do we realize there is still a lot of work to do in our building program? Once we make our commitments, it will be time for a building committee to work with an architect to plan the use of our site.
- What is the total of our commitments? Our goal for this campaign is a stratosopheric (I made that word up) amount of 1.3 million dollars. When we began this campaign, I did not think we could achieve that amount. But that is the goal God has led us to set given the input of Bill Walter and Church Growth Services.

On June 9, we plan to announce the total commitments. I believe that if we have the right answers to all the previous questions in the above list, then the answer to the last question will be exactly what it needs to be.


