

Christians should pay close attention to evangelical teaching about forgiveness. The gospel is at stake. Don't accept all you read and hear. Much of today's teaching on forgiveness threatens to reshape the gospel. I look forward on Sunday evening (3/7/2021 at 6:00 PM) to updating our congregation about current forgiveness



and repentance projects.

Crossway published *Unpacking Forgiveness* in 2008. By God's grace, it is still a part of forgiveness discussions 13 years later.

Writing a book requires sacrifice from everyone involved, especially family. Our children were young when I was "unpacking forgiveness." I picture Mary Beth praying faithfully as a four-year-old for the book. I also remember a Fourth of July when my family celebrated without me. I'm thankful for my patient wife!

The sacrifices have continued since publication. Off the top of my head, across the last 13 years, I remember preaching in Washington D.C., Florida, Montana, Washington state, Texas, Wisconsin, Iowa, Vermont, New Jersey, Indiana, Kentucky, England, and Africa. I'm sure I'm missing somewhere. I can't begin to list the radio or podcast interviews. Just thinking about all the writing, preaching, and interviews makes me *tired*.

Given all that writing and preaching requires, someone might ask, "Is it worth it?"

The answer is emphatically "yes." It is imperative that I (and we as a church) continue to submit to the Lord's call to see all of life – including forgiveness – through the lens of the gospel. This is a discussion we must not concede. I'll explain more on Sunday.

The truth of forgiveness is at the heart of the gospel. If we misunderstand what the Bible means about forgiveness, then not only will our resolution of interpersonal conflicts be short-circuited, but also the understanding of how God forgives those who repent and put their faith in Jesus will also be at risk.

Sadly, even within conservative Christian circles a biblical understanding of forgiveness is increasingly rare. On Sunday evening, I will summarize some of the ways that a biblical understanding of forgiveness is being distorted.
