Our church finds itself at a pivotal time in its long history. Let's remember the activities that should define God's people in the midst of trials.

I am writing this on April 28 and, given the Coronavirus Pandemic, we have not gathered for Sunday worship since March 8. Our sanctuary was completed in 1893. So far as I know, there has never been a period remotely close to this long without worship services in our space.

We grieve not being together. Fundamentally, a local church is about gathering together under the leadership of King Jesus to worship Him, to hear his Word proclaimed, and to observe the ordinances or sacraments. This pandemic has cut off some of our spiritual oxygen.

We face the added complication of the timing of bids for our church building plan. We need to make a decision about signing a contract at a time when our General Fund is under pressure and we cannot have a formal church business meeting.

The trial of the pandemic plops us down in a maze of decisions and we need to find our way forward and out of the labyrinth! How do we stream our time on Sunday mornings? How many meetings do we have and when? How do we engage with our church family about going forward with construction?

So, what do we do? I am making a personal checklist. The list is not exhaustive, but it gives some priorities.

- 1. **Pray** I pray the Lord will fill us with knowledge and depth of insight so that we can discern what is best and make decisions that bring God glory (Phil 1:9-11). I pray that the Lord will continue to raise up workers for the harvest fields who bring their expertise to bear on situations we face (Matt 9:35-38).
- 2. **Study relevant Scripture** We have stressed to our church family Scripture like Psalm 91, Proverbs 24:10, and now 1 Peter. Look those texts up. Let's meditate on them.
- 3. **Be patient** Whether it is in a Zoom meeting or during another morning when we cannot gather together any time we are in trials patience begins to wear thin. So far as I know, we are all doing very well but let's be careful in our homes that we take some walks, smile a lot, and show the fruit of the Spirit with one another. *This is really a sub-point of #6 below . . .*
- 4. **Listen** I've already mentioned listening to the Word, but we also need to listen to one another. One of the great joys of my life as a pastor is listening to men and women in our church who know far, far more about an area than I. Construction is an example of an area where I am thankful for the knowledge of our people about the construction process and various sub-contractors. Listening is something all of us show work on improving in over the long haul (Proverbs 19:20). I am also thankful we can listen to the input of Bill Walter and Church Growth Services.
- 5. **Rest** This is a long trial. We are weeks into the suffering, and we have weeks and months in front of us. So, we need a rhythm of rest (Exodus 20:8-11; 31:17).
- 6. **Love** 1 Corinthians 13 describes what should be the distinctiveness of Christian community (John 13:34-35). ⁴ Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant ⁵ or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; ⁶ it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. ⁷ Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

FROM PASTOR DAVID ...

"Therefore you are great, O LORD God. For there is none like you, and there is no God besides you, according to all that we have heard with our ears." 2 Samuel 7:23

This declaration by King David was made in the context of a prayer reflecting on God's goodness and promises to him personally and the people of Israel generally.
