It's time to enjoy our building program in very intentional ways. Many conversations are going to take place. Let's be prepared to share the vision for the Brick Center. Know in advance what will you say when someone asks what we are building?

Our church building program has moved forward

at a pace that makes a glacier look like a gazelle. We started talking about adding space in the early 1970's. We broke ground last week. It took well over forty years.

I point to the length of the project with a smile. We are thankful for our perseverance and patience. Our church's determination is going to be leveraged now to see people reached with the gospel.

There are good reasons for our pace. In order to expand facilities in town, it was necessary to acquire adjacent houses. And, we have been committed to a conservative financial pace. We waited to build until we paid off the houses and received around sixty percent of the pledges.

But now we have broken ground. We have moved from sitting through meetings (or more recently "Zoom-ing" via video through pandemic meetings) to putting a shovel in the dirt. We hope to be in the facility early in 2021.

So, what will we say to people when they ask what we are building? What is the vision for our new facility?

- Space for young people who are our future. Cramming over 30 youth in a small room wasn't working on Wednesday nights.
- Running room for children. It wasn't uncommon to have more than 100 children and sponsors for VBS or AWANA events.
- An accessible space available to our senior citizens that will be far safer to enter and leave.
- A new kitchen!
- Five new classrooms where we can talk about the really big questions in life.

The Brick Center will be a "corner for community"... a beautiful new space that invites exhausted people to hear the invitation of Christ. Just think how much our tired world needs to hear Jesus's words, "Come to me all you who are weary and heavy burdened, and I will give you rest (Matthew 11:28-30)."

FROM PASTOR DAVID

Much is changing as we enter the middle of summer. The start of construction for the Brick Center is very exciting and impossible to miss when we arrive at church. Worship services have taken place on two consecutive Sundays to end June. Regular gatherings of Bricks are being seen with greater frequency even if they look a bit different while we navigate the pandemic.

I am encouraged as I consider the studies undertaken by our youth in June. A small group of junior high students have been studying the Gospel of Mark on Monday nights via Zoom. Together we have seen the power and authority of Jesus as superior over both fallible human spiritual leadership and demons. The Wednesday night youth Bible study has started a series based on Christopher Bruno's book, *The Whole Story of the Bible in 16 Verses*. The goal is to see the integrity of Scripture from beginning to end in telling the story of the Gospel of our Savior and King Jesus.

Looking ahead to the rest of summer, we are gradually increasing ministry activity while monitoring guidance from local, state, and federal officials with respect to the pandemic. Our youth studies will continue in July along with some opportunities for fellowship and fun together in person. Adult Sunday school traditionally has suspended meeting in the past during the summer and that tradition will continue this year at least for the month of July.

I recognize the very spiritually healthy desire to meet together in person on the part of our people. In fact, we frequently cite Hebrews 10:24-25 as clear instruction from God's Word to be committed to meeting together: "And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." We do pray, "Come, Lord Jesus!" and we wait for the revelation of our blessed hope.
