Pray for our leaders and keep us accountable as we implement **Mortar Groups**: a new organization for our discipleship ministries.

This Fall we are

beginning a new organization of our discipleship ministry called "Mortar Groups." The idea of brick mortar pictures our vision of sharing life together as we assimilate people into the life of the church, care for one another, and learn more about the Christian faith.



It is vital that we understand as a church that we will not experience the joy of the Christian life apart from being mortared together in community.

The goal is for everyone who is connected with our church on every level to be assigned to a group with two leaders who are either pastors or leaders.

Ideally, these small groups would meet for Bible study and fellowship. However, we understand that the coronavirus may not allow us to meet as planned.

Whether your Mortar Group meets or not, you should be hearing from your leaders as they cast a vision for discipleship. Some of the questions leaders might ask include:

- **Assimilation questions**: What can you do to go to the next level of sharing life together in our church? Is it time to join?
- **Care questions:** Do you have any needs or prayer requests that are group should know about? Would you be willing to deliver a meal to this person who is going through a difficult time?
- **Christian Education questions**: What are you studying? What are you reading? Do you need any suggestions for growth? Would you be willing to participate in a Bible study with our group?

Let's Insulate the Walls with Prayer

We are inviting our families to submit prayers to the church office by September 25. Just write out a prayer or prayers for the new facility – pray those prayers as individuals or families – and then submit them to the church office. Our prayer is that our first ministry event in the Brick Center will be to put the prayers in the walls before the drywall goes up. *If* we get a good response, we will collect all of the prayers in booklet form to be a record for how we prayed as a church family. A family devotional guide entitled, "The Righteous Shall Live By Faith," will be given to families of Kindergarten through 5^{th} grade students. This will allow families to study the 10 Commandments as our elementary students learn about the Commandments in class. By incorporating a family devotional portion, "distance learning," becomes incorporated into family routines. We will also be working through New City Catechism questions 7-15.
