Would you pray this prayer multiple times in 2021? Could we make this a prayer for our church family?

We are challenging our church family throughout 2021 to pray the prayer of Ephesians 3:14-21. Maybe read it aloud to yourself right now!

¹⁴ For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, ¹⁵ from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named, ¹⁶ that according to the riches

of his glory he may grant you to be strengthened with power through his Spirit in your inner being, ¹⁷ so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith—that you, being rooted and grounded in love, ¹⁸ may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, ¹⁹ and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.

²⁰ Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, ²¹ to him be glory in the <u>church</u> and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Ephesians 3:14-21

Our last sermon of 2020 encouraged our church family with *how* to pray Ephesians 3:14-21.

- 1. **Kneel on Good News or Gospel Ground before the Father**. Remind yourself of the sovereignty of God and salvation by grace (Ephesians 1-3).
- 2. Place your hand on the shoulder of the brother or sister next to you. Notice the emphasis on the Church and other believers. You can pray this privately but you can't only pray it privately.
- 3. **Drop your head and rest in the power of the** Holy Spirit. You are not resting in your own strength, but rather the power of the Holy Spirit.
- 4. **Sing or hum** "The Love of God," quote John 3:16, or "**measure**" the love of Jesus Christ using a Cross rather than a tape measure.

(Ideally add an element that Pastor Chris's suggestions miss). Pastor David suggests arms in the shape of a Cross or one hand raised.

And then pray and ask God the Father through the power of the Holy Spirit to overwhelm your heart with the experience of the love of Christ.

The first sermon of 2021 envisioned what we might <u>expect</u> if we do pray this payer. (1) A renewed love for our church family and other believers. (2) Freedom from the anxiousness of a performance or works orientation and greater rest in the gospel. (3) More Christ-like conduct and progress in the defeat of addictions and bad habits. (4) More time adoring Christ in his word.

FROM PASTOR DAVID

And he who was seated on the throne said, "Behold, I am making all things new." Revelation 21:5a

More than three times in the past month I have read these words of God. Our family completed a multi-year chronological reading of the Bible together, personally I finished reading through the Bible in a year, and my daily devotional study through the book of Revelation concluded with the end of 2020. 2020, a year that seemed to amplify the brokenness of the world because of sin: disease, political division, social unrest, and isolation.
