P.L.E.S. Pray! - Please!

REMINDER: Thanksgiving Eve service is at 7:00 PM at Kishwaukee Pres (11/24/21)

Pray "PLES" for people (1) Physically (2) Logistically (3) Emotionally and (4) Spiritually.

Jesus words are so compelling.

⁷ "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. ⁸ For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened. ⁹ Or which one of you, if his son asks him for bread, will give him a stone? ¹⁰ Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a serpent? ¹¹ If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask him!

And yet – ask yourself this question: "If God answered all my prayers from the last week, what would happen?"

The reality is that God's people aren't asking God for nearly enough.

I wonder what would happen if our church prayed for revival and people turning to Christ in a really concerted way. What if we prayed that marriages would be healed? What if we prayed and asked God to use us to encourage hearts.

* * * * *

When someone facing a difficult season or challenge asks me to pray, I find it helpful to organize my prayers with this acronym (P.L.E.S.).

P – Physically – We are physical beings. We have many needs. And if Jesus doesn't come back, we will all go through enough to kill us. Such a sobering thought should move us to pray.

L – Logistically – Even when we lose someone we love, the grass still needs to be cut and bills have to be paid. It's hard. I often pray God will help someone get stuff done.

E – Emotionally – We are emotional beings and if our emotions are out of control, then we will be mired in depression, angry, or overwhelmed. Read Matthew 6:25-34 and pray for someone's emotions – Or Psalm 42-43.

S – Spiritually – We are in a great spiritual battle (Ephesians 6). Therefore, pray, that the Holy Spirit would fill us to the measure of the fullness of Christ.

I also find it helpful to journal prayers. If there is a blank sheet of paper on my desk – with a prayer request at the top – I find that I am compelled to write down a time I prayed. Likewise, Jamie and I occasionally do this at home.

Total Approved 2021 Budget = \$491,248 Divided by 52 weeks/year = **\$9,447**

As of October 31st, 2021, total capital campaign contributions received were \$1,476,539. This is 95% of total pledges made for the building program.


The Deaconess Board will be decorating the church and Brick Center on Sunday, November 21st at 11:30 am.
