Many people are exhausted and fatigued and don't know why. So often the reason is we are spiritually malnourished. To be strengthened, we need to worship with God's people. Otherwise, we will be weakened by a kind of spiritual "scurvy" – a deficiency from which millions die.

Maybe it's because I read Robert Louis Stevenson's *Treasure Island* as a young boy, or maybe it was because of the Walt Disney World, but I was always intrigued by pirates. It seemed to me that sailing the blue ocean,

looking for buried treasure on islands, while avoiding Long John Silver and Captain Hook would have been a great adventure.

Where pirate adventures were concerned, I knew which part I wanted to play. I wanted to decipher the map and find the treasure. I didn't want to walk the plank.

Much later while studying biochemistry, I learned that the real danger sailing the seven seas was not the presence of pirates. Rather, the real danger was the absence of Vitamin C. Because sailors so often lacked vitamin C on long voyages, many died miserable deaths from Scurvy. Indeed, it is estimated that scurvy killed more than 2,000,000 sailors from the time of Columbus until the transatlantic steam engine age. Sometimes the death rate for long voyages was much as 50% of the crew.

Eventually, the British discovered the problem and began to take limes with them. And Brits were nicknamed "limeys" in the process!

On a spiritual level, people in our culture are often malnourished and they have a form of spiritual scurvy without even knowing the real cause. We imagine that the fundamental reason we are so wiped out is one sort of circumstance or another.

But a fundamental reason so many people are weak and emotional is because they lack the "vitamin c" of regularly being together with God's people to be fed by the Word of God – to have our hearts and souls stirred by singing about the beauty of Christ – to be cared for and loved by God's people.

If you know someone who is setting sail on a long voyage to dig for buried treasure, then buy them a gift of limes. Or at least some vitamin C pills. But if you know someone who is sailing the seas of life, dealing with one challenge or another, give the gift of inviting them to church this Easter season.


