As lead pastor, my central obligation is to shepherd the flock through the preaching and teaching of the Word. This means I need to be prayerfully studying and growing in my theological thinking in an ongoing way. Here some ways I am currently doing so.

We continue in our series in 1 Timothy. The big idea I have preached in that book is that qualified leaders must lead the local church in protecting and upholding the Gospel of the Living God in a well-ordered church. If you would like to read more about 1 Timothy on your own,

John Calvin's sermons on 1 Timothy are excellent. I read an edition published by Banner of Truth.

I plan to preach a series on Ecclesiastes in the Fall. Along with Job and Proverbs, Ecclesiastes is one of three wisdom books in the Bible. As we read and meditate on these truths, they sharpen our wisdom saws so that we can cut our way through the hard wood of life.

Preaching Ecclesiastes is *very* challenging. So, I have a big stack of books I am working my way through now for a series I tentatively plan to begin preaching September 11.

Now would be a great time for the people in our church to start reading through the book of Ecclesiastes. If you read it 10-20 times between now and the Fall, then it would position you to benefit even more from the series.

If you would like to study Ecclesiastes on your own, you might start with the book:

Gibson, David. Living Life Backward: How Ecclesiastes Teaches Us to Live in Light of the End. Wheaton, Illinois: Crossway, 2017.

My fellow doctoral graduates (and a few others) will meet next week to study Colossians and Philemon with Dr. Douglas Moo. Dr. Moo is one of the greatest living Pauline scholars. The opportunity to study Philemon with Dr. Moo is of special interest given my work on forgiveness. Given how much we have preached from Paul's letters in recent years, we likely won't get to Colossians from the pulpit for several years.

Devotionally, I am using the book, Be Thou My Vision (Crossway). It lays out a plan for reading through the Bible and includes both the Heidelberg and Westminster Shorter Catechisms. It also includes a number of beautiful prayers.

I also benefit from podcasts. I highly recommend the podcast "Life, Books, and Everything Else," with Kevin DeYoung and sometimes Collin Hansen and Justin Taylor. Kevin is also worth reading on his web site and in *World* magazine.

Pastor David, Rev. Lance, and I continue to be thankful for the *New City Catechism* and its inclusion in our worship services. To be sure, it is brief: only 52 Questions. But it provides us an opportunity to outline the Christian faith each year. I pray that our families will all review it throughout the year.
