PASSING PLATES

We're passing plates for communion services beginning August 7. Sealed communion elements will still be available for those who have health concerns, but for most of our church family we will be passing the plates.

During the pandemic we minimized the passing of plates including both the communion trays and the offering plates. But we have now arrived at

the "new normal." Rest assured. If you prefer to use sealed elements, our plan is for those to be available.

What stands behind this message is our church's belief in the importance of community in worship. Men coming before the church to distribute communion trays – the passing of the offering plates by ushers – the plates going back and forth across the aisles – these dynamics have importance not only for the distribution of the elements but also for being together as church family – for a place to worship – for seeing one another.

#### **HOW DO PEOPLE CHANGE?**

An Extended Exposition of 2 Corinthians 3 and the Doctrine of Sanctification

One of the most practical questions of the Christian life is the question of how we should pursue true change. This question is a question about the area of theology called sanctification. Sanctification is that area of doctrine that considers how Christians increasingly become more like our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

All Christians know the difficulty of this question. On the one hand, we can easily identify areas of the Christian life where we repeatedly fall short (sin). We get mad. We eat too much. We are impatient. We are selfish. We make good gifts more central than the God who gives these gifts to us (idolatry).

Yet even as we recognize those areas of sin, and determine to do better, we find ourselves spinning our wheels.

Why don't we make more progress? The question is puzzling for Christians because we know that children of God are born again by the power of the Holy Spirit and the Spirit is at work in the life of the believer. And so, we ask ourselves, "If the power that spoke all things into existence is at work in my life, why do I keep eating too many pop tarts?"

Having concluded our series in 1 Timothy, I (Pastor Chris Brauns) will begin a new series that considers how Christians change. This series will be an extended reflection on 2 Corinthians 3 and the doctrine of sanctification.

For those of us who are frustrated by a lack of progress in the Christian life – for ourselves and for the people we love – this is a series you don't want to miss.
