"Trust the LORD with all your heart . . ." Proverbs 3:5a

Proverbs 3:5-6 are favorite verses of many Christians:

<sup>5</sup> Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.

These verses deserve to be among our favorites! They give both direction (trust God) and a promise (God will guide us in life).

Who would not want to lean into these verses?

But we need meditate on these verses. It's worth asking: "What exactly does it look like to whole-heartedly trust the Lord?" The context answers the question.

<sup>7</sup> Be not wise in your own eyes; fear the Lord, and turn away from evil. <sup>8</sup> It will be healing to your flesh and refreshment to your bones. <sup>9</sup> Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the firstfruits of all your produce; <sup>10</sup> then your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will be bursting with wine. Proverbs 3:7-10

We see at least six characteristics true of those who trust the Lord with all their hearts.

- 1. To lean not on our own understanding is only possible if we hear God's Word. Those who trust the Lord with all their hearts *value the reading and preaching of the Word*. Their church attendance and engagement in worship demonstrates this.
- 2. Those who trust the Lord with all their heart *are humble*. "Be not wise in your own eyes" the verse reads.
- 3. Those who trust the Lord with all their heart "*Turn away from evil.*" Do our Netflix and Amazon Prime accounts show that we turn away from evil?
- 4. "It will be healing to your flesh and refreshment to your bones." Those who trust the Lord with all their heart are refreshed by the Spirit. Are we energized by the Spirit? How is your energy level?
- 5. Those who trust the Lord with all their heart give generously to God's work. "Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the firstfruits of all your produce." Do our giving statements demonstrate a commitment to the Lord's work?
- 6. Those who trust the Lord with all their heart have bursting barns. Is God blessing you?

So here is the question we face this Thanksgiving season. Are we people who trust the Lord with all our hearts and lean not on our own understanding?

#### FINANCIAL REPORT


Through October 31, 2022


The Deaconess Board will be decorating the church and Brick Center on Sunday, November 20<sup>th</sup> at 11:30 am.
