If you feel awful – and you do what you feel like doing – you will almost always feel worse. Live in submission to the Word, not your feelings.

Our church family knows that each year I review a one-page letter I give to graduating seniors. The question I address is this, "What do I pray you do not forget as you go forward?"

The reminder I am seeking to give focuses first on the Word of God. But I also want to bring the Word to bear in the context of the particular

challenges of our day. I am seeking to especially respond to areas that are contested.

This year I am adding a slight revision to point #4 in the list of eight reminders. I added a sentence to emphasize that we should not live under the authority of our feelings.

4. Sharpen your wisdom saw with the Word. Wisdom is "skill for right living." It is the "saw" we use to cut our way through life. We need a sharp saw to make quality decisions. We begin our quest for wisdom with the fear of the Lord and continue sharpening our wisdom saws by memorizing and reading the Word and by hearing it preached. Be Word-centered! Rinse in Scripture. It is more precious than gold and sweeter than honey. And it is God's Word, not our feelings, that should be authoritative. If you feel awful – and you do what you feel like doing – you will almost always feel worse. Rather, live in submission to the Word, not your feelings.

This encouragement may seem obvious. After all, if we all ate what we feel like eating, our health would be terrible. If we worked when we feel like working, we wouldn't get much done. But it is necessary to make this point because one of the false gospels of our day – maybe the most significant false gospel is that of **expressive individualism**. Expressive individualism teaches that the way to the good life is for each person to determine what is best for his or her life.

Expressive individualism is part of the "trans" movement. Young people are told their feelings and perceptions are more authoritative than their own biology.

Expressive individualism also tells young people that their understanding of life is a more reliable indicator than the input of their parents. This false narrative is tearing apart the fabric of the family and destroying lives.

Rather than the lie of expressive individualism, we want our young people to hear verses like these:

There is a way that seems right to a man, but its end is the way to death. Proverbs 14:12

Listen to your father who gave you life, and do not despise your mother when she is old. Buy truth, and do not sell it; buy wisdom, instruction, and understanding. Proverbs 23:22-23



FROM PASTOR DAVID ...


God says in his Word, "Buy truth and do not sell it; buy wisdom, instruction, and understanding." Proverbs 23:23
