INTO THE WARDROBE

An Invitation to a Reading Group from Pastor Chris Brauns

Consider participating in a discussion group of <u>The Lion, the Witch, and the</u> Wardrobe. But to do so, you must submit a reading report to me by 7/2/23.

I'm trying something new . . . I'm planning to host a reading discussion in late summer. I will wait to see the level of interest and commitment before designing the format.

But if you are interested, here is what you must do to participate. Submit a reading report by July 2, 2023.

- 1. On a reading report submitted to me by 7/2/23 include the following.
 - a. A <u>statement</u> of how and when you read or heard. For example, "our family listened to an audio version during the week of 6/4/23," or, "I read it during the evenings of May 28-30." Better, "I read with a flashlight under my covers" after the lights were out.
 - b. Write or type out 5 favorite quotes including the chapter and page number of your edition. The quotes can be one sentence and should not be more than 2-3 sentences.
 - c. On your own, summarize the central point or aim of the book in no more than 2-3 sentence. For instance, if you were doing this exercise for the movie, "The Wizard of Oz," you might write, "a young lady resents colorless Kansas but, in the end, realizes there's no place like home." Just do your best. The key is to attempt to summarize the central point you think C.S. Lewis is making.
- 2. **This exercise is open to any age.** Children who are old enough to write out the quotes themselves and listen to a discussion are encouraged to participate.
- 3. You must own a personal copy (not electronic) of *The Lion* . . . So, at the discussion group you can't share a copy with someone else. Ideally, you have a copy you can mark up. Don't show up with an I-pad. It's a non-electronic discussion.
- 4. **Know that 7/2/2023 is a firm deadline.** I understand not everyone can complete by the assignment by then. This discussion group will be for those who can find time and are so inclined. Please don't ask for an extension. Just wait for another opportunity.
- 5. You must have read or listened to C.S. Lewis, *The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe* within the last year.
- 6. **Watching the movie does not count**, nor will its existence be acknowledged in the discussion group except to say that we aren't going to discuss it.
- 7. If you have not previously read *The Chronicles, read <u>The Lion first.</u>* Some (unfortunate) editions have *The Magicians Nephew listed as the first book in the Chronicles.* In our late modern age, we live in a world that is often uncivilized. One of the things that separates learned society from the barbarians is that we read The Chronicles of Narnia in the proper order. If you are interested in the debate, you can see Trevin Wax's post, "Why You Should Read Narnia in Publication Order." But it's better just to open up *The Lion . . .* and start reading. By the way, it is likewise a mark of spirituality if you don't say much about the movies. Movie versions should normally be mentioned in polite society.


