Christians Just Want to Have Fun

Are we going to have fun? That's what I am thinking about as your pastor this Christmas season.

The old people (as well as those who listen to oldies) may recall that in 1983 Cyndi Lauper reduced the aspirations of women everywhere to the simple declaration, "Girls

1983 Cyndi Lauper reduced the aspirations of women everywhere to the simple declaration, "Girls just want to have fun." The song struck a chord. Lauper's tune has been covered by over 30 artists and was named one of the top 100 songs of all time.

We might wonder why "Girls Just Want to Have Fun" was such a hit. To be sure, it was not great poetry. No one will compare it to Beethoven's "Ode to Joy." Cyndi Lauper's hairstyle was questionable. And, as a man, I sort of resent the implication that it is only the sisters who want to enjoy life. But in any case, the song climbed the chart.

Parenthesis: I wonder if I am the only pastor/theologian in history to analyze Cyndi Lauper's music. It is possible.

But here's the deal. Maybe the reason the song resonated is that because one of the *needs* of human beings is to have fun, to experience joy, to laugh, to be free of all the demands of life that weigh us down.

Cyndi Lauper was wrong, of course, to say that anyone "*just*" wants to have fun. Life is too full of significance and meaning to be reduced to the simple pursuit of fun. And pursuing fun as an end is itself a sure strategy for not having fun at all. But, again, Lauper was on to something in that we do need fun.

The question then, becomes, how do we legitimately pursue joy and celebration. And how as a pastor do I help our people pursue that vision. All Christians – not just the ladies – want to have fun.

Thinking about how we can celebrate and be joyous and have fun takes me to the book of Nehemiah. You know I often quote Nehemiah 12:43.

And they offered great sacrifices that day and rejoiced, for God had made them rejoice with great joy; the women and children also rejoiced. And the joy of Jerusalem was heard far away. Nehemiah 12:43

That verse gives the vision for our Christmas Gift exchange. But everyone just wants to have fun at Christmas. The question becomes *"how"*? How do we go about pursuing joy this Christmas season?

I think a big part of the answer to how we're going to have fun is found in Nehemiah 8. Throughout December at different points, I will point out some ingredients that combined give a recipe for joy. Maybe you should read Nehemiah 8 in advance and see if you can identify how your family could have a more joyous Christmas. We do, after all, want to have fun. *And the joy of the Lord is our strength* (Nehemiah 8:10).
