If you faint in the day of adversity, your strength is small. Proverbs 24:10

Each year I begin a new folder on my computer for a new year of newsletter articles. I began full time as pastor at the Red Brick Church in January of 2005. So, I just opened my 20<sup>th</sup> folder for a new year of articles. My hair is grayer, but the system is the same.

When writing newsletter articles, I consider the question, "What does our flock need to be thinking about this month?" For example, In June of 2009, I wrote about the Romans series I was preaching on at that time.

Writing the articles for some months I need to stop and think for a bit to consider what to write about. But this year it is clear. My bride's surgery is scheduled for January 10.

There's no way around the challenge of our situation except to say that this will be a major and life altering surgery. The need to remove cancer from both Jamie's pancreas and liver leaves no alternative. Pancreatic surgery is especially challenging. Our surgeon has explained to us more than once that sewing a pancreas up is like sewing up tissue paper. Leakage usually follows. One doctor explained to me, "the pancreas is an angry organ. It does not like to be messed with." In contrast, the liver is more resilient.

All of us are most concerned about Jamie. But Jamie's surgery will also require sacrifices by our church. Now entering my 20<sup>th</sup> year at our church, it's amazing to look back and see that God has given us wonderful health for all those years.

But here we are. I will miss a number of Sundays. I'm not sure if I will be present for the annual meeting. Thankfully, we are well organized administratively. And we have lined up excellent preaching. But it's still bound to be hard.

So how do we motivate ourselves to be at our best? I guess it depends somewhat on how a person is wired – and I challenged our church with this during the pandemic – but the thing that ought to fire us up is the thought that we are going to be at our best when times are the hardest. I mean it really is the case that if you crumble like a vanilla wafer under pressure then you prove you never had that much character in the first place.

The point of Proverbs 24:10 is that if we falter in times of trouble, we prove we never had that much character in the first place.

Thanks, by the way, so much for all the food and attention. Jamie and I deeply appreciate it.

But food is the part that is relatively easy. The more difficult and even impossible thing to do is to serve and be unselfish. That is the hard thing and so many of you serve.

I say it's impossible – and sinners such as we are – it's difficult. But what makes serving in the day of adversity far easier is knowing that we have Christ for an example. He never faltered or failed. And he is our King. We are his people. We will not falter in our time of trouble.

Our Ladies Bible Studies (both Women of the Word and Mom's and More) will be starting a Winter / Spring Bible study very soon!





So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ. Romans 10:17


Christians, we are a people saved by faith. The Bible clearly tells us God's means for forming repentance and faith in us. He does it by the work of his Holy Spirit and Word.

Last year at this time, I shared with you that I was shaking up my reading plan. Often, I don't do the same through-the-Bible plan in the exact same way year after year. In 2023, I followed the Robert Murray M'Cheyne Bible Reading Plan, reading through the ESV. In the past, I've read through the Bible using other plans or English versions.

The M'Cheyne plan concluded the year with 2 Chronicles, Malachi, the Gospel of John, and Revelation. Laid side-by-side, day after day, readings from each of these books complement and contrast the experience of God's people over centuries. The reading plan lends itself to seeing the big story of the Bible many of the days during the year.

If not a reading plan, might you consider committing to listening to the Bible each day? Crossway has several daily podcasts by men and women who love God's Word reading the daily passages following different plans.
