Recommended Reading for Parents

I understand that reading requires an investment of time and money. If you are a listener rather than a reader, then consider searching for podcast interviews of these authors.

Haidt, Jonathan. *The Anxious Generation: How the Great Rewiring of Childhood Is Causing an Epidemic of Mental Illness*. Penguin Press, 2024. Anyone who works with youth and young adults knows that we are facing an epidemic of anxiety. Haidt theorizes why this is happening. The World Magazine article, "<u>The Portal in their Pockets</u>," engaged with Haidt's book. I emphasize again, Haidt is not writing from a Christian perspective. Reading discerningly.

Shrier, Abigail. *Bad Therapy: Why the Kids Aren't Growing Up.* New York: Sentinel, 2024. Denny Burk wrote a brief review of Shrier's book that you can find online. In that review, he points to a *Christianity Today* review that was critical. Shrier raises many questions about our therapeutic culture.

So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ. Romans 10:17

"How many of you listen to podcasts?" This was a question asked in a recent gathering of Bricks. The number of hands was modest but not an overwhelming majority in the room.

We live in an age when we might drown in an ocean of information. Simply put, the volume of resources available, print, video, and audio media, creates a problem for us to choose. No one can consume everything and the rate of production of material continues to accelerate.

How do we steward time to feed our growth to maturity as disciples of Jesus? One way is to focus on trusted resources vetted by other Christians, especially leaders at The Red Brick Church. In an ongoing way, we maintain a Google Document of <u>Recommended Podcasts for Bricks</u>.

A word of caution, don't expect to listen to all of them. In fact, consider if the description of the podcast is new to you and give a couple episodes a listen. When you find a podcast that addresses needs of you or your family, adopt a regular listening routine. You might have a podcast for the time you get ready, complete household chores, commute, or exercise. The two recommended Family Discipleship podcasts are short enough to tag on to the end of a meal, perhaps right before dessert.
