Pray for the Lord to bless our plans for the facilities of the Red Brick Church. Phase II of our Brick by Brick Campaign planning is underway. We are seeking input on priorities. Meetings are taking place with CVG Architects.

1	Welcome Space : a foyer where we greet and welcome people, wait for services to begin, allow caskets to be moved, and for us to distribute information about the church.		
2	A Nursery that invites growth, offers a private area for nursing mothers, and that organizes drop-off.		
3	Toddler and children's church : space that needs to be in the same building as the sanctuary. Currently the area below the sanctuary is used.		
4	Accessibility: Worship, study, and counseling space that is easily accessed by our entire church family and has adequate handicap parking.		
5	Safety : Entrances that can be monitored from inside (so greeters can look out in the winter) and that are properly secured.		
6	Beautiful well-lit facilities - that do not look tired and dated.		
7	Quality Seating in all areas of the sanctuary. The overflow and balcony do not offer quality seats.		
8	Audio / visual systems that allow us to preach and lead music with excellence.		
9	Quality signage around our campus that reflects our identity.		
10	HV/AC that allows the temperature to be maintained in a way that is not a distraction either due to temperature variance or loud fans.		
11	Counseling Space : Private space that also allows accountability (so glass in doors or adjacent windows).		
12	Administrative Space (including workroom) that is professional in appearance and maximizes productivity.		
13	Study space for (pastors/intern) that offers adequate shelving and communicates a message of excellence in keeping with the gospel and is inviting to potential staff.		
14	Adult education space connected to sanctuary such that it is easily accessed and sufficient in size.



In this Western-themed VBS, kids will learn all about who this amazing Jesus is as they dig into questions such as:


- What amazing things happened surrounding Jesus' birth?
